


FROM THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

This month I'm transferring the President's Corner to Board Director Karl Mielenhausen, as Karl has an interesting bit of news to convey to us, as follows:


A Photographic Discovery by Karl Mielenhausen

As some of you know, I spent my professional



Many of the prints had been contest entries in the 1980s and 1990s, and several show a history of having been entered in numerous competitions throughout the country as well as internationally There were both color images and monochrome, and it appeared that they were all film-based and printed in the Kodak Camera Club darkrooms by Mr. Lewis. Ironically, I was using those same darkrooms at about the same time.

The KCC was a wonderful perk for employees offering all sorts of equipment, as well as free paper and cut-rate pricing for chemicals (all premixed and ready for use). Bill reports that he shot primarily reversal films and then used inter-negatives to allow for color enlargements. Some of the prints indicate significant skill at post processing, including techniques such as solarization. Remember, this is a timeframe before consumer digital cameras and Photoshop!



It took me a few weeks to track down Bill Lewis. Sometime after leaving Kodak in 1990, he and his family moved to New Bern (Greenbrier) and he became a chemistry professor at ECU. His neighbor, Elizabeth Dunn, was one of the founders of the New Bern Camera Club in 1991. Bill joined and helped create a stronger New Bern Camera Club. At ECU, Bill was good friends with current CPC member Paul Gemperline.

At Kodak, Bill had been involved in research and development for Ektachrome films, including support of the professional market, as well as space applications. He used Nikon film camera equipment and eventually transitioned to digital using a Nikon D700 DSLR.

Bill and his wife, Mary, have resided in Sun Lakes, Arizona for some 21 years. Bill was still entering print competitions up until 2019. He was a winner of many awards in the club competitions and jokingly, "he was the one to beat." After working hard all these years to help build skills within the Sun Lakes Camera Club, Bill was recently presented with the esteemed award - Lifetime Honorary Member.

It was a pleasure to unravel this mystery and have a chance to meet with Bill and Mary via two Zoom calls. In the next few weeks, with the help of Jeff Sherman, we will be getting Bill's prints back to him. I plan to talk more about Bill's photography at a future club meeting.














